People are identified by labels, but should it be used for a context to insult others? The power of acceptance has taken over us thus when feeling unaccepted, we tend to partially change ourselves just to fit in the society. We have known our society to be 'Judgmental' but we learn. People learn.

We sacrifice our uniqueness and abilities, hide our flaws, change who we are – all in the hopes of feeling normal and accepted. We soon forget ourselves and the real us is gone from our lives and our world. It is well said, "ACCEPTANCE HAS NO EXCEP-TIONS."

Questioning – refers to someone who is still figuring out their gender by trying to identify their sexual orientation.

These terms have been used to display content or disapproval toward the LGBT community for decades but are now being reclaimed.

Moreover, phrases such as parasexual, ageder, gender queer, bigender, gender variant and paragender are also used sometimes to express the people in this community and also the supporters of the community. History owes an apology to the LGBT community and their families for the public shame and disgrace that they have suffered for centuries. The members of this society have been excluded from the social setup for a large span of time and have lived a life full of fear of retaliation and of being treated badly.

After a battle of two decades, on September 6, 2018, the supreme court of India passed 'Section 377' of the Indian Penal Code which criminalized homosexuality or same sex marriage.

Considering the present statistics provided by our government regarding this modification, the following measures have rightfully been legalized:

Homosexual activity in India

Donating blood

Conversion therapies

In addition to that, age of consent is equal to all.

However, adoption by homosexuals and serving in the military are still illegal in the country. Employment discrimination and housing discrimination require sexual orientation and gender identity as well. Thus, the government still does not give complete protection to the community under any circumstances of discrimination.We moved one step ahead but also took one back.

This deprives us of our happiness but at the same time makes us feel proud for being the citizens of India – where people fight for their right, their happiness and their well-being; where people are ready to support every soul as its their very own; where people are not scared to speak the truth – regardless of all the political, social as well as the religious barriers.


Shreya Khetan reports on the recently concluded Military History Seminar in WBS

I he Welham Boys' school here inaugurated what has been billed as the country's first seminar on military history on Friday. Students from 28 schools from across the country participated in the event. Opening the seminar, former Army chief Gen (retired) V K Singh, said that "it is important to understand military history of India so as not to repeat the mistakes of the past and to strategise better. Indian military history is replete with examples of bravery, honour and courage." In the two-day long 'Military History Seminar 2017', students will be made aware of India's relationship with neighbouring countries such as Pakistan and China, as well as about the Kargil war in 1999, among other topics. Authorities of Welham Boys' said the purpose behind organising the conference was to "get young minds thinking about various facets of the Indian military". They also said that events such as these might lead to schools even adopting military history as part of their curricula. Eight girls from Hopetown participated in this seminar. They engaged themselves in several discussions and asked questions such as a prospect of friendship between India and Pakistan, combat roles for women in the military, dearth of enough officers in the Army, among many others issues. The seminar ended in comprehensive research papers, written under the guidance of staff mentors at Welham Boys' school.

The Principal of the school Gunmeet Bindra said, "Perhaps today, people between the age of 10 and



50, know almost nothing of the action in Kashmir in 1947-48 or the wars in 1962, 1965, 1971 and Kargil war of 1999. This is apart from the tension that persists on our borders. In all countries of the World such ignorance is avoided and our children should also be taught their own Military History. We need to bridge this gap and this seminar is a modest effort in this direction."

Connectivity, Defence Top Agenda In Modi's

Japan Visit: Defence and connectivity, with an eye to China, will top the agenda when Prime Minister Narendra Modi makes his two-day state visit to Japan from October 28. The two governments will make announcements regarding two agreements allowing closer naval cooperation.

Khashoggi body parts in Saudi envoy's garden?:

Even as an investment conference opened in Riyadh in the shadows pf the killing of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, which prompted a boycott of the conference by Western politicians, top world bankers and company executives, Dogu Perincek, leader of Turkey's main opposition Rodina party, claimed that Kashoggi's body parts were discovered in a well in the garden at the Saudi consul general's home in Istanbul, Haberler reported.

Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan said in a speech in Ankara's Parliament that there were strong signs Jamal Khashoggi's "savage" (as pointed out by Turkey) killing was planned, and attempts by Riyadh to suggest it was a rogue operation by intelligence operatives "will not satisfy us".

India summons Pak envoy over death of 3 soldiers: India summoned a senior official of the Pakistan high commission in New Delhi on Tuesday and lodged strong protest over the loss of lives of three of its soldiers during an infiltration bid by Pakistani terrorists in the Sunderbani sector of Jammu and Kashmir on October 21. The Pakistan high commission official was summoned to the ministry of external affairs(MEA) and a demarche was made, MEA said in a statement.

NATO soldier killed in attack in Afghanistan: A NATO soldier was killed and two others wounded in a Taliban-claimed attack in Afghanistan on Monday, days after a US general was wounded in a shooting. "Initial reports indicate the attack was committed by a member of the Afghan security forces," NATO's Resolute Support said in a statement.

KEJRIWAL ATTACKED WITH CHILLI POWDER IN **SECRETARIAT**

NEW DELHI: Delhi police have detained one person for throwing chili powder at Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal. The man, who identified himself as Anil Kumar, allegedly attacked the chief minister near his office inside the Secretariat building. Kejriwal's Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) condemned the incident, calling it a "serious security lapse." They also described the act as "politically motivated" while asserting that the BJP is hatching a conspiracy in collision with Delhi police to attack the minister.

Police said 40-year-old Sharma, a resident of Naraina has been detained for questioning. While the AAP blamed the BJP for the alleged attack, the Delhi chief of the saffron party Manoj Tiwari said such incidents "cannot be tolerated or justified by anybody" and called for a high-level probe.


