'DOSA KING' DIES WEEK AFTER LIFE SENTENCE BEGAN

BENGALURU: P Rajagopal founder of Hotel Saravana Bhavan (HSB), a chain of south Indian quick service restaurants, passed away on Thursday in Chennai, a week after he surrendered to serve out a life sentence for abduction and murder. Founded in 1981, Saravana Bhavan soon

became a Chennai cultural icon. For nearly two decades, for millions Chennai citizens eating out meant going to a Saravana Bhavan. He is survived by his sons, Shiva Kumaar and Saravanan, and two wives, Valli, and Kiruthiga.

Govt seeks CCI review of Big Four auditing firms: The government wants the country's anti-trust body to assess whether the so-called "Big Four" auditing firms and their affiliates are hurting competition in any manner, a senior government official said. The Competition Commission of India (CCI) needs to conduct a survey or an investigation to assess whether the 'Big Four' that include PwC, EY, Deloitte and KPMG are abusing their dominant position in the Indian audit market, said the official. The ministry of corporate affairs, which holds that view, is yet to send any formal request to the CCI to probe the matter.

Time to move on from controversy over Trump's remarks, says India: The ministry of external affairs said it was time to "move on" from the controversy over US President Donald Trump's remarks about mediating in the Kashmir dispute, even as it reiterated its call for Pakistan to take irreversible action against terrorists operating from its soil.

IIT-Bombay to finally hike fellowships:

More than six months after the Centre decided to hike the stipend given to research scholars, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IIT-B) has finally decided to implement the decision.

In an e-mail sent to post-graduation (PG) students of the institute, Prasanna Majumdar, deputy director(finance and external affairs) announced the institute will start disbursing the revised stipend for fellowships from August.

Opposition and Shiv Sena seek quota for locals in pvt sector jobs:


A day after Andhra Pradesh passed a law reserving 75% jobs for locals, the Shiv Sena and Opposition parties demanded a similar law in Maharashtra. The state government has, however, said the percentage of locals employed in private industrial units is close to 90%. Maharashtra has a policy of employment of 80% of locals in industrial units. Harshadeep Kamble, development commissioner (industries), said,"The policy is mandatory for units availing government benefits and we ensure it is maintained."


Notorious Mexican drug lord Joaquin Guzman is expected to be sentenced to life in prison
