The story is based on a robber who has done atrocious deeds and has now been sent to hell to compensate for his sins. He is given a chance to save himself and climb to heaven by using a spider's thread. This opportunity presents to him as a ray of hope, quite literally, to save himself from the deep depths of hell and its never-ending torture. But halfway up, he notices other sinners trying to procure the same salvation by climbing after him. He orders them to get off in fear of the thread snapping but this very unworthy act causes the thread to snap and sends him plummeting back. The primary conflict of this story, as I like to believe, is not about the robber's choices or the spider's thread or even the ruler of heaven who saw the robber writhing in pain in the depths of hell and decided to give him a chance by sending that singular frail thread. Its more substantial than that. It is about us and the world we live in.

In this world, most people come to such means of livelihood when they have nothing for their sustenance. What's ironical about this is, that the society that they live in is designed in a way to sustain that very life and its means to live. Discoveries!

SHARK INTESTINES FUNCTION LIKE TESLA VALVES!

The Tesla Valve, invented by Nikola Tesla, almost a century ago, is a series of interconnected teardrop shaped loops designed to pass flows of fluids in only one direction with no moving parts. Or to put it simply, in a tesla straw, you would only be able to drink water from one direction and not the other.



This interesting feature can also be found in the physiology of a shark, an astounding example of biomimicry on Tesla's part. The intestines of a shark are designed in a way that allows fluid to flow only in one direction without any backflow. From their scans, the researchers discovered several new aspects about how shark intestines function. It appears that these spiral-shaped organs slow the movement of food and direct it downward through the gut, relying on gravity in addition to peristalsis, the rhythmic contraction of the gut's smooth muscle. This has shed light on how the food eaten by Bruce from 'Finding Nemo' digests. Most sharks usually spends days or even weeks between eating large meals, so they rely on being able to hold food in their system and absorb as many nutrients as possible. The slowed movement of food through their gut caused by the spiral intestine probably allows sharks to retain their food longer, and they also use less energy, processing that food.

SLIME MOLD STORES MEMORIES WITHOUT EVEN HAVING A BRAIN!

Slime Mold, are not actually fungi but cousins of single celled amoebas that can find their way through a maze and remember the location of food. All without the benefit of a brain, seems like having a brain is not that important.

By measuring the changing diameters of the slime Mold's tubes, the researchers noticed that when it found food, it developed a computer simulation of the organism's behavior, researchers found that the tubes closest to a morsel of food got thicker while those farther away, withered and sometimes disappeared entirely. Given their observations, the researchers think that when the slime Mold detects food it releases some chemical that softens the walls of nearby tubes, allowing them to expand. WING 'CLAP' SOLVES THE MYSTERY OF BUTTERFLY FLIGHT

How does a gorgeous but tiny butterfly flutter, literally like a 'butterfly'? You will be surprised to know how even a delicate butterfly also uses physics to fly. It forms an air pocket between the wings which, when the wings collapse, makes the jet even stronger and more efficient. This creates a certain thrust that helps in making their flight easier.

The flexible wings dramatically increase the force created by the clap. Their speed is further increased when faced by predators, meaning every flutter of their wings is actually a neatly calculated application of Physics that would put even aerodynamics to shame. Luckily, this is more of an embedded and intuitive gesture on butterflies' behalf rather than their attempt at being the next Einstein. Better luck catching a butterfly next time!

During this role, Ivenko found himself forging a deep connection with the character he was portraying because they shared the same values, life philosophy, etc. 4 years later Oleg Ivenko now returns to the part by performing a famous pas de deux in a celebration of Nureyev's word at London's Theatre Royal Drury Lane. Oleg Ivenko said, "I'm very sorry to see what is happening in Ukraine".

Oleg hasn't really lived in Ukraine for quite some time but prays that everything will be over soon.
