Critical Analysis The Spider's Thread by Ryunosuke Akutagawa

This Japanese fiction is a rudimentary juxtaposition of the good and the bad presented before us by the famous author Rashomon. The story is based on a robber who has done atrocious deeds and has now been sent to hell to compensate for his sins. He is given a chance to save himself and climb to heaven by using a spider's thread. This opportunity presents to him as a ray of hope, quite literally, to save himself from the deep depths of hell and its never-ending torture. But halfway up, he notices other sinners trying to procure the same salvation by climbing after him. He orders them to get off in fear of the thread snapping but this very unworthy act causes the thread to snap and sends him plummeting back. The primary conflict of this story, as I like to believe, is not about the robber's choices or the spider's thread or even the ruler of heaven who saw the robber writhing in pain in the depths of hell and having decided to give him a chance by sending that singular frail thread. Its more substantial than that. It is about us and the world we live in.

In this world, most people resolve to such means of livelihood when they have nothing for their

sustenance. What's ironical about this is, that the society that they live in is designed in a way to sustain that very life and its means to live. Yet, in that very system, supposedly designed for them to thrive in, is the very place they find themselves trapped in. Then comes that ray of hope, a way out from this never ending economic hardship. Of course, they would jump at the opportunity. But so would everyone else who is on the same boat as him. But is it fair to only help one man or a group of unfortunate individuals? How can one come to such a subjective and impossible estimation, all in the very society designed for them to thrive in! This story, in my perspective is much more than just about heaven and hell or good and bad. It's a satire on our society and our life, the ruler of heaven, being the framers of this society, the ray of hope being the chance to survive and sustain, like robbing a house. A difficult hard chance filled with prolonged suffering such as climbing the long never-ending rope to heaven. It's almost futile and all it does is, prove the ruler as a sadist. It is not fair to categorize people as good and bad, based purely on outward stimuli that are out of their control and then decide who would get a garden and who gets eternal pain.

It's 2024, you're a single mother, working two jobs; struggling to put food on the table. Your heart breaks everytime your child goes to bed with an empty stomach. You cry yourself to sleep wondering when you failed as a mother.

Roe v Wade was an important decision made by the US Supreme Court in which the Court ruled that the Constitution of the USA granted the right to choose to have an abortion. This right however, was not absolute and a person could have an abortion only until a fetus becomes viable, which is usually 24 weeks after conception. Over the years the case has been a central topic of debate as to what extent can the abortion be considered legal, who gets to decide it and where do peoples' religious and moral beliefs fit in all of this.

In June of 2022, the court overruled Roe v. Wade; removing nearly 50 years of federal protection and allowing states to make abortions illegal in their independent jurisdictions. This has led to abortion being completely unavailable in 14 states and the enforcement of severe bans in 8 others as of December, 2022

The 'Great American Dream' has now turned into a nightmare for most citizens. According to a survey conducted by BestColleges of 1000 current and prospective undergraduate students 39% of the students claim that the court's decision directly impacts their own choices as to the states in which they want to attend college(s). Furthermore, restricted abortion rights will have direct impacts on jobs all around the country. "I'd rather have my life than millions of dollars", Kristi Bradford who walked away from a three hundred thousand dollars job offer.

This situation will only continue to get worse and there might be millions of deaths, attempted suicides etc. if citizens don't get the right health care they deserve.

SHOULD ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS BE GRANTED RESIDENCY

Imagine the same situation just on a larger scale where people break through your country borders and create trouble for the government and disrupt the personal lives of the citizens. That's what illegal immigrants do. The soft humble side of ours do want to provide them with a roof on their heads, social security, health and education benefits. But that's not practical in real life.

If countries start improving their citizen law and allow immigrants to keep coming in and providing them with everything one could ever wish for be it jobs, steady income, a warm home etc., all of this invites a huge number of aliens to enter your premises which results in annulment of the security of the nation. Open borders terrorist group entering and attacking, criminals getting a free pass to flee away destroys the ethnicity of the nation. In a research conducted by the Texas Department of Public Safety, it was found that undocumented immigrants have reported substantially lower crime rates than native citizens. What all these people are trying to do, is to seek refuge in a place where there is no threat to them of being killed, where there are better living standards for their family and where they don't have to think whether today's the last time they'll see their loved ones. Just try to put yourself in their shoes for once, away from the safety of your home, your haven, stuck between war and death, losses and tragedy. These people have gone through a tremendous amount of trauma and struggle, they are not coming in your country to steal your jobs or instigate any revolt, they are only there to live their live as peacefully as each one of us is entitled to.

Russo-Ukraine War

The cold war between Russia and Ukraine originated on the 20th of February 2014 which proves how the citizens have been living in fear for the past nine years! The heat between both nations started to rise in 2021. The basic idea of the war has been how Vladimir Putin, the President of Russia, wants to invade Ukraine and re-establish a Russian Empire, while preventing a democratic encirclement around Russia. As both nations are significant producers of oil and natural gas, this has resulted in a 30% price hike of the commodities. The price rate has not only jumped for the respected commodities but also the global exports for wheat and rice and other food stuff. IMF also reports how globally we will face a fast rate of inflation.





BRITAIN'S ENERGY CRISIS

It certainly is not cheap being green. British Consumers face an eye-watering price high in their bills ever since October 2022. Around £3,459 i.e, \$4,115 for an average household.
