Watermelon mint mocktail

Ingredients

2 fresh mint leaves, plus more for garnish

- Ice
- 3/4 cup watermelon juice (see Tip)
- ½ cup club soda
- Small slice watermelon for garnish

Directions

1.Mash mint leaves in the bottom of a large cocktail glass or pint glass with a muddler or small wooden spoon. Fill the glass one-third full of ice; add watermelon juice. Top with club soda and garnish with a watermelon slice and more mint leaves, if desired.

- Blue curacao syrup- Blue curacao is made from the dried peel of the Laraha citrus fruit. It has a vibrant blue color and an orange-like flavor. Use blue curacao syrup for this recipe that has no alcohol and is very sweet. It is almost like a blue, orange flavored simple
- Lemonade- Tart lemonade adds a great taste to this blue long island
- Iced Green Tea- Green iced tea has a light flavor and is full of antioxidants. Green tea helps make this drink healthy and delicious!
- Lime Juice- Fresh lime juice adds a strong zing to the drink that you will love.
- Maraschino cherries and lime slices- A bright red cherry looks incredible in the glass of blue long island. A lime wedge adds the perfect finishing touch to the glass.



ENGLAND'S BANKING CRISIS


The banks of England again sought to stem a sharp sell-off in Britain's 2.1 trillion pound government bond markets on Tuesday, expanding its emergency buying to inflationlinked debt.

The downfall in the economy has resulted in havoc in the nation with an increase in recession risks for the broader economy.

The banks of Uk, after facing thus another financial crisis are purchasing 'bonds' to seek a reverse for what it sees as "dysfunction" in the bond market.




INDIA: ICT TARIFF



According to a government official, India will respond against a European Union law if it is used in response to an Indian appeal against a decision on ICT tariffs at the dispute settlement panel of the World Trade Organization (WTO). The rule permits the EU to terminate concessions and apply trade restrictions. The faulty dispute settlement panel of the WTO determined that India's tariffs on mobile phones and electronic parts violated the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade. These conclusions were reached following the EU's 2019 WTO panel summons of India about the ICT issue.


The Diamond Collection is the first compilation album by Post Malone. it features artists like Quavo, 21 Savage, Ty Dolla Sign and Swag Lee.




CALL ME BY YOUR NAME
